November 2014

On October 28, 2014, the CPSC reached an agreement that resulted in the largest civil penalty in CPSC history—a civil penalty of \$4.3 million. The civil penalty was premised on allegations that the company failed to immediately report defects and/or unreasonable risks of serious injury involving 11 models of minibikes and go-carts.

The CPSC alleged that the company sold the minibikes and go-carts nationwide from November 2004 through June 2010 for \$200 to \$2,000. In June 2010, the company filed a Full Report with the CPSC. The CPSC alleged that by that time, the company had already received four reports of fires from leaking gas caps and burn injuries to consumers, including burns to a child. The company had also allegedly received 24 reports of stuck throttles. While the company had implemented design changes to remedy the throttle hazard, it had allegedly not notified consumers nor the CPSC of these changes.

In addition to agreeing to pay \$4.3 million, the company also agreed to maintain a program to ensure compliance with safety statutes and regulations enforced by the CPSC. Click here for the civil penalty settlement agreement.

The failure to report occurred after the company received seven reports that children had become entangled on the inner cords of the Roman shades.	\$700,000
