Welcome to the December edition of the Alston & Bird CPSC Recall Snapshot.

The CPSC seems to have fully recovered from the Shutdown. After announcing only 12 recalls in October, the Commission made up for lost time and announced 21 recalls in November.

In addition to being active on the recall front, the CPSC issued a press release early this month with some startling statistics on holiday decorating injuries. According to the press release, there were approximately 15,000 emergency room visits in 2012 for holiday decorating injuries. The press release also notes that "the most frequently reported holiday decorating incidents seen in emergency departments involved falls (34%), lacerations (11%) and back strains (10%)."
