Joanna is ranked Band 1 by *Chambers USA* for White Collar Crime and Government Investigations, and in 2019, *Chambers* shortlisted Joanna for its prestigious New York White Collar Crime & Government Investigations Lawyer of the Year award. Coffin, U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit.
