Miriam actively serves her community, having worked alongside the Hon. Kimberly Anderson in the State Court of DeKalb County to develop policy recommendations for eradicating human trafficking in Georgia. Miriam also served on the Atlanta Board of Education's Equity Task Force, which drafted the Atlanta Public Schools first equity policy. In 2022, Miriam was inducted into Outstanding Atlanta, which is Atlanta's premier honor for exceptional leadership and community involvement, and received Atlanta's Rising in Community Excellence Rising Star Award.
